- PAC will not address past situations as we are looking to move forward and not go backward. As for requests that were submitted on behalf of others it is important that those individuals bring up those concerns with the PAC executive themselves. In accordance with the bylaws, we will not be discussing any situation pertaining to a single individual. If you wish to discuss individual concerns, you can reach out to the executive team to discuss further.

- There were concerns around lack of communication. PAC agrees there is an
 opportunity for improvement and encourage those who have concerns to step up and
 into a role of PAC Executive in the upcoming school year.
- It has been communicated and demonstrated that there will be clear & transparent communication around the budget. There are no concerns from the PAC executive around an audit.
- The PAC executive has not made any attempts to purposefully exclude anyone at anytime.
- The current PAC supports an application for the gaming grant for the 2023/2024 school year. Only the school and student community lose out if funds are not received. It was confirmed by BCCPAC rep that Gibson is eligible.
- There are no future hot lunches planned for the remaining of the school year.
